

Developer asks for meeting

The developer of the Parkerville Highlands project, Westland Group, has expressed interest in meeting with Stoneville Progress Association Chairman, Mike Davies.

The company believes a meeting would give it an opportunity to present project plans in detail and address concerns.

A Westland Group spokesperson said the project was meticulously planned to provide both much needed infrastructure to the area, as well

as a range of housing options for the changing community.

“There is much about the Parkerville development that we are proud of and would appeal to community sentiments,” the spokesperson said.

“It is important to understand however, that we do not represent the Stoneville development.

“These projects are by no means related and should be addressed independently.”

Mr Davies said that he and

members of the association would be happy to attend the meeting – which is expected to take place later this month – to discuss the details of the developer’s future plans.

Parkerville Highlands is located 10 km from Mundaring and 2 km from the township of Parkerville. The land zoned for development is about 700 acres and includes 250 acres reserved for public open space.

The proposed lot sizes vary from a minimum of

800 m² to two hectares, with the larger of the lots surrounding the development.

“The last thing anyone wants is to destroy the Hills environment,” the spokesperson said.

“What we are doing is creating a broader range of accommodation options for residents who cannot manage or afford the Hills’ limited supply of large land parcels.

“We believe this can be achieved in a sensitive and unobtrusive way.”
