## **Implementation Plan**

### **Step 1: .....2005**

Advise existing stakeholders by letter of project review and invite nomination of a representative(s) from each stakeholder group to join a forum. The letter of invitation would also propose a venue, day and time for meetings. It would also provide background information on two candidates to act as a facilitator for the forums and ask for a recommendation on who should fill that role from the supplied list.

The forum will be set up initially to agree the consultation process and timelines. It would then guide the ongoing consultation process.

Press release/advertisement in local newspapers to advise that the project is back on the agenda and that the Water Corporation will consult with the community to investigate site options and throughout the project's development.

An appropriate independent facilitator will need to be recruited for the forums.

### **Step 2: .....2005**

Hold the first meeting of the stakeholder forum. The forum needs to gain agreement on consultation process as well as understanding of project requirements and timing. Need to define roles of the Water Corporation and stakeholders.

The forum should also be used to outline site selection criteria for the location of the water treatment plant.

The Water Corporation will need to provide background information on the various sites that it has so far reviewed and the selection criteria it used as a guide.

Forum participants will have two weeks to provide feedback on the consultation process and selection criteria. The participants should also nominate possible sites for review. The Water Corporation will have one week to review the information prior to the next meeting.

### **Step 3: ..... 2005**

Hold meeting number two of the stakeholder forum to sign off on selection criteria and review the short-list of sites to be considered for further investigation.

Background information on all the sites would need to be provided to inform the debate and some consultancy support might also need to be provided.

If stakeholders agree on the shortlist, the Water Corporation will carry out detailed investigations over the next three months.

Once the shortlist for the sites has been developed, consultation will begin with the Nyungar Circle of Elders to address any associated Aboriginal Heritage issues.

**Step 4:** Monthly meetings to report progress.

**Step 5: ..... 2005**

Further Stakeholder Forum to present and discuss the preferred site.

**Step 6: ..... 2005**

Final site recommendation written up. Final report to be distributed to the community and a media release issued.
